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Course Overview

This course is a 4 hr refresher for early years designated safeguarding leads who have been in the role for at least 6 months to a year.

This course could also be used as a refresher course for those lead practitioners supporting under 18s who work within out of school settings, or as a childminder.

This course is ideally delivered face to face.

What will you gain from this course

- Develop and build on your knowledge and skills to identify, manage, and refer safeguarding concerns appropriately
- Refresh the role and main responsibilities of the Designated Safeguarding Lead and know about key changes in guidance and legislation.
- Reflect on your effectiveness in promoting a safeguarding culture
- Developing a contextual safeguarding approach to extra familial harm – looking at evaluating your own working practice scenarios
- Latest statistical information
- The Early Help Assessment Process
- Identify good practice in multi-agency working and information sharing
- Upon completion, you will be able to confidently protect the children you work with by implementing improved procedures through lessons learned

Course Requirements

This course is a refresher training session for experienced Safeguarding Leads (and those who deputise). Participants will have completed an early years or generic introduction to safeguarding and child protection as well as a full day Safeguarding Lead course. They will have had some experience in the role before attending this course.

There will be an expectation that all participants have a good knowledge and understanding of the 4 main categories of abuse as well as the signs and symptoms of these.

The course is designed for professionals and other practitioners who work as a safeguarding lead with children in Early Years settings (inc nurseries, after school clubs, childminders) who need to undertake a refresher course for the lead role within their organisation to update their knowledge and skills

Who Should Attend

- All experienced, qualified Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs)
- All experienced staff who deputise for DSLs
