

# Introduction to Safeguarding Adults Course

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## Course Overview

This 3 hr introductory course is for all people working directly with adults (over 18's) who may be at risk of abuse or neglect – delivered online.

The course explores a basic understanding of which adults may be at risk and how organisations working with young adults need to respond to concerns regarding abuse or neglect. The focus of the course is the understanding the key differences between safeguarding children and adults and the role of a front line professional in supporting vulnerable adults and responding to situations and concerns

## What will you gain from this course

This training is designed for those who have limited prior knowledge of safeguarding adults but are working directly with those aged over 18 who may be at risk.

By the end of the course you will be able to:

- Name the groups of adults at risk and understand specific risks for young adults (18-30 years)
- Describe the different categories of abuse
- Recognise the signs and symptoms of abuse
- Act in line with the policy and procedures if you suspect abuse
  - Identify support organisation's and referral partners locally

## Course Requirements

This course is an introductory course for those who are new to their role in supporting adults or who have little or no experience of protecting them from harm.

There is no expectation that participants come with any prior knowledge as this is a basic level course.
